1. Call to order and introductions

The meeting was called to order by President Bill Gigray at 3:04 p.m.

2. Approve Agenda (call for additions) William F. Gigray, President

i. Minutes of March 27, 2019

It was moved by Jan Johns, seconded by Gary Segers to approve the minutes of March 27, 2019. Motion carried unanimously.

- b. Treasurer's Report not given due to absence of Phil Peterson
 Please note: Ada County Commission (BOCC) granted 100.0% tax exemption 3/26/19 on
 property owned by F.A.C.T.S. (Note Added: Parcel Number: SO522244300 was purchased
 April 5, 2010 by F.A.C.T.S. for \$ 4,000 even though 2010 Assessment notice showed
 Assessed Value of \$ 5,500. The assessment of \$ 6.50 annually is for Drainage District #4.)
- c. President's Report William F. Gigray, President
 - i. Follow-up to Letter to Idaho Walk/Bike Alliance Cynthia Gibson talked to Don Kostelec to get a date for F.A.C.T.S. presentation in May or June. Kim Warren has been in regular contact with Cynthia, both of whom agree on safe intersections on roads of five or six lanes being huge barriers to pedestrians. Bill Mullane noted that the University and Capital Blvds. at BSU intersection with islands now works beautifully. Bill Gigray agreed that intersection safety consists in good design. He would like to have ITD and A.C.H.D. engineering input as part of the F.A.C.T.S. goals.
 - ii. Next agency(ies) in front of which to make other presentations and continuing with city of Meridian on important linkage to park below Phyllis Canal Gary Segers spoke before Steve Noyes Parks, Pathways and Recreation Commission in Eagle last week. New folks on that commission so important to get the word out. Next one could be city of Middleton. Gary will appear at the next month's meeting of city of Star Gary Recreation Commission where he will take two PPTs and blend them into the message; he also will emphasize Eagle Island to Linder Road.

- iii. Linder Road Upgrade Bill asked Mark Wasdahl if there were any upgrades on Linder/Hwy 20/26 and S.H. 16 to Eagle Road. Mark responded that COSTCO area starting on half of it this fall. Steve Noyes commented on Linder Road design as going to five lanes, potentially seven. He would like F.A.C.T.S. to get on A.C.H.D. agenda for the Bicycle Advisory Committee on protected bike lane and vertical grade right-of-way. Mark Wasdahl added that the city of Star comprehensive plan includes bike-ped corridor on S.H. 16.
- iv. Condition of Garden City pathway link near Expo Idaho horse barn plans are not yet formulated for Expo Idaho horse race track so nothing to report on pathway.
- v. Third bridge to access Plantation Island Bill Mullane said there are a lot of unknowns: at what point is the access, which is intriguing from the standpoint of avoiding the 52nd Street detour. There are maintenance and cost issues of course. Easements are still being surveyed on Plantation Island that will be designated for Idaho Department of Lands. Idaho Foundation for Parks and Lands is still in negotiation on the potential transfer of Plantation Island involving an exchange and certain other easement considerations in the Barber Pool area.

d. Special Ad Hoc Committee Reports

- i. Rails with Trails Update Paul Mann, Gary Payne Paul Mann said that the contract with ALTA is signed and a kick-off meeting is planned for next Wednesday, between 2-4 pm on the COMPASS first floor. Kim Warren with city of Meridian under leadership of Steve Siddoway is working west of Meridian City Hall to 8th Street north of rail corridor one-half mile to one mile toward Linder on which four easements currently are involved. City of Meridian will partner with Nampa-Meridian Irrigation District to tile some drains and give needed permission to contact owners.
- ii. 2009 Boise River Trail plan update Liisa Itkonen Being handled by COMPASS ACTIVE Transportation Work Group
- iii. EISP State Park Connector Steve Noyes

 Three easements signed to get to Newman. Newmans wanted Hart-Davis Ditch to
 be satisfied with access. Flood District #10 will be using 300-400 cubic yards of pitrun as part of the non-public access for getting to Eagle Island State Park and
 satisfying the Newman family. Construction specifications on the pathway are good
 enough to provide access for vehicles and equipment as well. Steve has FEMA
 grants underway on Site 2, which will get the trail to Newmans.
- iv. Star Neighborhood Bicycle and Ped Plan Kim Ingraham
 It has been turned over to councilman. Bill Gigray asked how will Star connect to pathway as it moves toward S.H. 16 and connect with city of Eagle coming west?
