  - Gary attended and gave testimony at the hearing 7/24/19 on the Five Lanes to Seven Lanes with Shared Pathway A.C.H.D. study. He testified that the 7 – foot width of the shared pathway was too narrow. However, The Linder Road Study Preliminary Plan was adopted by the A.C.H.D. Commission that same date with a 2 to 2 vote and the chair's casting the deciding vote.

  - i. Rails with Trails Rachel Haukkala, COMPASS
     Study might be done by this Friday from Nampa to Federal Way terminus.
  - ii. 2009 Boise River Trail Plan Update Gary Segers
     Gary is a member of the ACTIVE Transportation work group and under the direction of COMPASS the plan will be updated and managed.
     The electric "data" bike is set for 10 mph; rough terrain makes data collection difficult.
  - iii. Eagle Island State Park Connector Robert Minch and Steve Noyes
    The easement was presented to Don Newman, his wife and son; now their attorney
    is reviewing the easement language. It was hoped to exemplify progress on the EISP
    connection for the 9/21 Greenbelt 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary; if the family is not comfortable
    with that, and consider it premature, it will not be included as part of the
    information materials. Steve Noyes referred to Hazard Mitigation Grant Program
    (HMGP) administered by FEMA for which Eagle has made a grant application.

  - v. Third Bridge on Plantation Island Discussion

    It is important to get Army Corps of Engineers on board, specifically Eric Gerke for a walk through. - c. Signage, Branding, Maintenance & Integrating mileage marker
  - i. Jeff Shinn has lived here since 1969 and has ridden on all of the horizontal trails. He heard of F.A.C.T.S. when going out to see the bridge near the W. Boise Water Treatment Plant. He admires how F.A.C.T.S. agitates to get things done. Persons ride through all these jurisdictions without knowing where they begin and end. He complimented the "Eat, Live, Work, Play" signs and suggests that the greenbelt include such signage as "Entering Boise", "Leaving Garden City."
  - ii. Mark Eubank commented on the Bike Boulevard running from Camel's Back Park along 11<sup>th</sup> Street to Shoshone Street Bikeway. Mark, in talking to noncyclists, says there is nothing to tell a car whose driver needs to be told he or
