She came back to Boise from Ketchum in 2014 and started a mobile "app" for navigating Harris Ranch and then expanding as a navigational/connectivity tool for three cities and a major university, family commuters and recreationists. Gary Payne commented on the interest areas featured and not having to be just map savvy. You can save and share your favorites and post need for repair. Boise and the surrounding area have an ecosystem built around the greenbelt. Tell people about the "app." Meantime Nannette and Jim are invited back to any of our meetings.

c. Sierra Club petition re: trails along canals -

Eric Willadsen, Sierra Club, Idaho Chapter, started in April of this year. He also is a member of Land Trust of the Treasure Valley. A combination of Idaho Conservation League, Conservation Voters of Idaho, Nampa Bicycle Project, Boise Bicycle Project and Treasure Valley Cycling Alliance are working toward a Treasure Valleywide Plan to be adopted by municipalities, which can constitute a big ask for federal funds. Such goals as everyone being within one mile of a pathway populate the energy of this alliance. Mark Eubank asked about using canals. Right now, this alliance is meeting twice a month for an hour in Boise leading up to a Summit. Eric will send the schedule to Gary Payne and Bill Gigray. Steve Noyes would like to be involved and Gary Segers along with Bill Mullane would like to interface with this group.
